The art must present a positive, distinct visual image that captures the essence of this award-winning festival and community.. ELIGIBILITY: Participants must reside in North Carolina. All submitted artwork will be judged without discrimination based on race, religion, sex, marital status, national origin, or creed. All work must be original work by the artist submitting the entry.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- SIZE: any size up to 18" x 24"
- Two dimensional - UNFRAMED
- Attach COMPLETED entry form on back, top, right corner
- DO NOT SIGN WORK winning artist will be allowed to sign after contest and may be asked to sign a limited number of prints.
- Original may be in all water mediums, pastel, oil, marker or graphite
- No typography is required for a fine art submission.

SELECTION CRITERIA: Judging will be based upon:

- Artistic creativity – use of medium
- Judges are not obligated to select a winning design from submitted entries

WINNING ARTIST: Winning artist will be awarded \$500.00 for all reproduction rights as well as the following:

- Artist may be asked to remark a very limited number of prints
- Artist will approve proof before printing

- Artist will be awarded a booth on Saturday and Sunday during the spring festival (April 24 & 25) to showcase/sell their work
 - Dogwood Festival will split proceeds 50/50 with artist at the end of 1 year, or upon completion of sale, whichever occurs first.

HEAFNER / WILLIAMS VOCAL COMPETITION seeks to identify and offer assistance to highly talented vocalists and to encourage the theatrical vocal arts. The competition is open to singers from ages 18 - 40 who are residents of or enrolled in school in North Carolina.

REPERTOIRE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must present selections from at least three of the following five repertoire categories:

MUSICAL THEATER, OPERA, OPERETTA, ORATORIO, and CLASSICAL SONG

PRELIMINARY TAPE ROUND

- Submit an audio cassette tape or CD of 3 selections. No video tapes.
- Three of the five repertoire categories must be represented. At least one choice must be in English.
- Label your tape carefully with your name and selections.

From the tapes submitted, the judges will select those singers who will be invited to participate live in the competition at the Lincoln Cultural Center. You will be notified as soon as possible.

DEADLINE FOR ENTRY: **FEBRUARY 6, 2010**

SEMI-FINAL AND FINAL ROUNDS

- Prepare 3 selections for each round. You will have 6 different selections. No medleys.
- These 6 selections must be chosen from at least 3 of the 5 categories. You do not need to represent all three categories in each round. You only need to meet the requirement over all 6 songs. For example, you may choose 3 required selections and the rest are your

choice from any category. You may choose more than 3 categories. No one category is more important than another.

- You must represent more than one category in each round.
- Of the 6 selections, at least one choice must be in English.
- If you choose Opera and perform more than one aria, each must be in a different language and style and have a different composer.
- You may repeat from the Preliminary round if you wish, but you may not repeat from the Semi-Final to the Final Round.
- The judges will hear all 3 of your selections in each round. You may change your order of songs at the competition within the rounds, but not between the Semi-final and final Round.
- You will be allotted 15 minutes for each round.

Changes in repertoire can be made only until March 9, 2010

MEMORIZE ALL MUSIC APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. An audio cassette tape or CD.
2. The completed application form filled out in its entirety. Incomplete application forms will not be processed.

Repertoire for all rounds must be determined at the time of application. Please go to the website

3. A 150-word (maximum) biographical sketch suitable for the program. Include musical background and experience.

4. An 8" x 10" black and white photo.

5. A non-refundable

We will provide housing if you are too far away to drive for both rounds.

We do not provide accompanists.

We will assist in your finding an accompanist if necessary.
